3. Are you for or against the development of a commercial event center or similar type of commercial facility at the Vail Golf Course Clubhouse building? Why?
4. Are you for or against maintaining the protective covenants that were established at the beginning of Vail? Why?
5. Were you for or against the Solaris project? Why?

## YOUR VOTE MATTERS!

This November 5th, Vail's registered voters will decide who will fill four of the seven seats on the Vail Town Council. With Vail's limited population of registered voters, every vote counts. Early voting begins October 24th and continues thru November 1st.

Due to changes in the state's election laws, the Town of Vail **no longer automatically mails ballots** to all voters who had previously requested to vote by mail. We encourage you to [verify that you are registered](#) to vote and to [request a mail-in ballot](#) now if you do not plan to vote at the polls. Completed requests for mail-in ballots must be received by October 25th.
